We see a Counseling Center—we're going to invest deeply in FAMILIES. Sophisticated issues require sophisticated support. As we launch this effort, we're going to see the divorce rate drop. The suicide rate will drop. Anxiety in our teens will decrease. The weight of stress and fear will be diminished. We will come alongside women. We will come alongside men. We will come alongside parents and help them navigate for their children the disruptions surrounding morality, sexuality, gender, and identity. We're going to bring more people to Jesus.

We see a Pastoral Residency—we're going to call people to invest deeply in LEADERS. Once again, the church will call young, emerging leaders to surrender to the call of ministry. We're going to raise up pastors and leaders. We're going to create a pipeline of leadership for the future needs of Southwest Church and the needs of the surrounding churches in our world.

Southwest has never striven to be the best church IN the valley. We've only aspired to be the best church FOR the valley. And as you witness our heart to bless others, my prayer is that your soul will be stirred to get behind what God is doing with your time, talent, and treasure.

One of the greatest honors we'll ever know is the privilege of serving this congregation. From the bottom of our hearts, we are thrilled by what God has done and what God is going to do at Southwest.

Our hope is to raise \$2M before the year's end to unleash compassion for CHILDREN, FAMILIES, & LEADERS. It's a lofty goal—but nothing is too hard for God. Your prayerful consideration and support of what follows will be more than enough. In that we trust. Remember—it costs nothing to dream. And everything not to.

A LOOK BACK ON "SLAYING GOLIATH"

Southwest Church was founded on “the gospel.” And not some religious feel-good-ism. The word gospel is the English version of the Greek term for good news. And not good news in general, ala humanism. But good news in a very specific, historical sense, centering in a person, namely Jesus—and His death, burial, and resurrection (1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

During my years at Southwest, we were very careful to keep coming back to that 3-prong message. Since it is foundational to Christian doctrine, I would usually conclude my preaching with a presentation of that great truth and an invitation to place faith in Jesus. God honored that, and we had people trusting Jesus on a regular basis.

When I made the move to Southwest, the church owed \$11,000,000. Needless to say, that was a real “drag” on the ministry. We desperately needed to eliminate the debt. Since it was gigantic, I thought of the Old Testament giant named Goliath and suggested that we call the debt Goliath and appeal to the people, including the kids, to “slay Goliath.” God honored our effort, and we slew Goliath in 3 years, 9 months. What an accomplishment! And what a relief!

As Southwest looks toward the next 50 years, may it be with a renewed commitment to Jesus’ directive to make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that He has commanded us, knowing that He will be with us always, even to the end of the age (Matthew 28:18-20).

In the ups and downs of that quest, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that our toil is not in vain in the Lord (1 Corinthians 15:58).

50 YEARS OF GOSPEL-IMPACT

In the fall of 1971, a group of people began meeting for bible study at a home in Palm Desert, California.

Two of those group members were Ivan and Junnie Munson. They moved to the desert in the early 1970s and attended the bible study. It is their love for the Lord that led them to want others to know Him.

And a year later, that small group would grow and they would have a church service at the Catholic Recreation Hall.

In February 1973, the articles of incorporation were filed as Desert Evangelical Church. The church would meet on Sundays at the Palm Desert Community Center. And a few years later, they would change the name to Desert Evangelical Free Church.

In January of 1985, Ivan Munson would be part of the groundbreaking ceremony on Hovley Lane for Desert Evangelical Free Church. And the first service at the new location would take place on December 5, 1985.

The church continued to grow as they shared the love of Jesus with the community. Years would pass as many lives were transformed and the gospel continued to go out. Eventually the church would grow and move to the corner of Fred Waring and Washington Street in Indian Wells.

And that church, which began as a small group at a home in Palm Desert, is now Southwest Church.

Erica Powell Fleischmann, the granddaughter of Ivan and Junnie Munson, attends Southwest. She has been coming to Southwest since her parents started attending in 1983. Being part of the church that her grandparents co-founded has left a generational impact on her family over the years.

“My grandparents were always active within the church, not only did they have a local business so they knew a lot of people, but as the children of the church we knew everybody,” Erica said.

Erica said that as a child she remembers how the different generations would build relationships and spend time together after church.

“The young generation always knew the older generation of people—that’s always something that’s special,” Erica said.

And it’s that time that she spent with the other generations that shaped her.

“I think for me it’s understanding how God wants me to treat others—whether that’s children or adults,” she said.

Over the years, Southwest has continued to grow. Whether Erica was coming back from college or living abroad, she always had a community here.

“When I would return to church, I always had a family here,” Erica said. “This church has grown so large, but I still have the core community of people that I know.”

And now, Erica has two kids who are growing up in a church that their great-grandparents co-founded. Her grandparents and parents modeled what it looks like to follow Jesus and serve others well.

“My grandparents served for as long as they possibly could, similar to my parents,” Erica said. “I am in a season now with young children that makes it a little bit more difficult—one of my passions is music and I’ve been trying to serve within the worship team as much as I can.

She added, “Watching their example and being here as much as possible for my children to see me volunteering. That’s a great example for them.”

Ivan and Junnie Munson faithfully followed Jesus and because of that, many people have heard the gospel and their lives have been changed. And God is continuing to use the people of Southwest to disciple generations.

“My grandfather was a Jesus follower,” Erica said. “He wanted everybody to know about the Lord.



PRESCHOOL



GOAL: \$600,000

PRESCHOOL

The ultimate character of a people is revealed in the way it treats its children. Southwest is nearing her 50th year of ministry! We will celebrate by blessing children of our valley. We will win children for Christ!

The past few years have been challenging for all of us, but no one felt the weight of these changing times more than children. The Covid-19 pandemic was a perfect storm with isolation, remote learning, and disconnection from teachers and friends. All of these stresses were coupled with the uncertainty many of their parents were facing. The statistics, supported by extensive data, are alarming. Children of all ages are experiencing record-high levels of stress as well as developmental, social and academic delays.

Inspired by the Gospel of Jesus Christ, we are creating a safe, welcoming and structured environment. We advance our work by hiring Christian educators who share our vision for education. We strive to have an

environment where our instructors consistently deliver a profound experience to students, at the intersection of Christianity and education.

Building the Valley's leading Christian preschool

After years of prayer and discussion, our clarity has come into sharp focus. As we strive to uphold traditional values, we see our preschool as not only a steadfast source of educational programming but also an experience that places God at the center. Based on our founding principles, our priority is a preschool that puts our values into action.

Guided by the heart of the Father

We know that as we form the hearts and minds of children, over time, we elevate and transform the entire community. God's plan for our future is to embrace and invest in the next generation.

As we teach the Bible, we will help children understand what it means to follow in Jesus's footsteps, embrace prayer and worship, be a part of a loving community and serve others. And our children will know that, beyond all doubt, God loves them.

THE SOUTHWEST PRESCHOOL WILL:

- Center on the Gospel of Jesus Christ in alignment with the biblical convictions of Southwest Church
- Service 118 Families
- Be designed with 10 classrooms to accommodate children from 6 weeks to 5 years.
- Staff approximately 20 full-time, Christian educators
- Earn a projected \$500K in revenue that will sustain the preschool and fund strategic ministry initiatives.
- Open in August 2023

COUNSELING CENTER

One of the names given to Jesus Christ is that of “Wonderful Counselor.” The term “Counselor” from Isaiah 9 depicted the imagery of a consultant who stands in between a person and their problem and shows them the way out.

Families have endured increasing stress and pressure, especially since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. The past three years have revealed an alarming spike in mental unhealth for men, women, and children. The people of our congregation and the people of our valley need the hope of our Wonderful Counselor—Jesus Christ!

• **Six in 10 practitioners** reported they no longer have openings for new patients; nearly half (46%) said they have been unable to meet the demand for treatment and nearly three-quarters (72%) have longer wait lists than before the pandemic.

Counseling and connection: a path forward and a lifeline

We are seeing the mental health effects with a level of brokenness and despair we have not witnessed in our collective lifetimes. It’s across all socio-economic groups, whether people live below the poverty line or have the affluence to access exceptional health care. And though individual mental health challenges vary, the shared dilemma is people are at-risk or in pain. Counseling and connection offer both a path forward and a lifeline.

Presenting Gospel-centered counseling as a ministry of Southwest

We believe that Christian counseling is a tool God can use to bring transformation in the lives of His people. We feel called to offer

Christian, licensed, professional counseling to our congregation and community as they walk through challenging seasons of their lives.

And as God reminds us, "I am the LORD, who heals you." (Exod. 15:26)

We want people who are hurting to know we are here to help and God loves them. We will meet the moment with a Gospel-centered counseling center, staffed by qualified, licensed counselors who share our biblical convictions. Our foundation of services is being developed to offer Gospel-centered solutions through mental health treatment and services. Our counseling center will be located in a private and protected area of our building that will provide a safe space for people to find healing during difficult seasons of life. With sensitivity and best practices, Southwest Church is creating a resource that exists to serve the community.

Short-term campaign. Long-term solution

Our campaign to build the counseling center is a short-term initiative designed to offer much-needed services until the center is self-sufficient. Services will be paid for by insurance and, when necessary, supplemented by additional funds. More than anything, we want everyone who requires counseling services to know that just as God loves them, we too, care deeply.

A Gospel-centered counseling center comes to life

The Southwest Church counseling center is being designed to accommodate both families and individuals including the very specific needs of children and teens. With the power of the Gospel we will see parents empowered, kids encouraged, students equipped and lives changed. Together, let's bring to life the Gospel-centered counseling center.

- Feature Christian, licensed, professional counselors
- Accommodate every season of life by offering counseling to families, marrieds, singles, men, women, students and children.
- Service our congregation AND the surrounding community.


RESIDENCY

My early days in the pastorate were guided by the tutelage of my then Pastor and Grandfather, the Reverend Willie Jenkins, Jr. Upon the culmination of my training and just before he released me to my first charge in Oakland, my grandfather's commissioning words were, "You now know where the landmark is. And you understand how to talk to the old and how to talk to the young and bring them together. So, go now and serve the Lord."

Those few short years invested by my Pastor's side, coupled with the wisdom garnered therein, have not only fueled the past twenty-five years of life and ministry for me, but also that of dozens of other pastors I have shepherded. For young pastors in the early days of ministry, guidance and training from wiser, more seasoned leaders is the essential foundation upon which fruitful ministry is built—and as we survey the current ministry landscape in America, maybe now more than ever, its importance cannot be overstated.

For young leaders to make it in ministry today, life-on-life mentorship is not just essential; it is everything.

Moses' father-in-law said to him, "What you are doing is not good. You and the people with you will certainly wear yourselves out, for the thing is too heavy for you. YOU ARE NOT ABLE TO DO IT ALONE." (Exodus 18:17-18)

Where are we now?

Though uttered just days after the Israelite Exodus from Egypt, Jethro's words speak almost prophetically to the state of pastoral ministry today. It is reasonable to assume that those who care for the spiritual and emotional needs of people are reeling themselves, as those needs have skyrocketed amidst the sweeping disruption of 2020. Increasing opposition to the gospel, the lasting effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, the pressing demands of leadership, and a seemingly unshakeable loneliness we nearly all carry have each contributed to the general malaise that hangs over so many leaders.

It should come as no surprise then that pastors today are considering leaving full-time ministry at rates higher than many of us have ever seen in our lifetimes. Culture is unrelenting, churches are fractured, and pastors are weary. In the midst of the chaos, one thing has become clear.

Jethro was right. **None** of us can do this alone.


Where did all the young leaders go?

What's more, pastoral burnout is not the only issue the Church faces in the coming years. The American pastorate is quickly aging, and the latest research suggests that fewer and fewer young leaders seem to be pursuing a life dedicated to vocational ministry. With each passing day, as more and more pastors are either on the verge of resignation or, simply, retirement, the potential of an approaching leadership chasm becomes increasingly likely. If the Church does not act, who will be there in the coming years to steer the ship as she ventures deeper into these uncharted, post-pandemic, post-Christian, post-modern waters?

What is God calling us to do?

As a gospel-centered, multiethnic, intergenerational church that "loves discipleship," Southwest is uniquely positioned to step into these complex and yet compelling issues.

What if we created an experience that provided emerging pastors the training, support, exposure, and lifelong relationships needed to flourish amidst the ever-growing challenges of ministry today?

What if that space also made room for godly, faithful, and eager young leaders to **discern** their ministry calling, **discover** the intricacies of who God has made them to be, and **develop** the skills and intuition needed to shepherd God's people with both care and courage?

What if a group of older leaders, committed to the well-being and long-term success of those who would come after them, invested extended time pouring into these young pastors?

What if one program could encompass all of that and more, and what if we could build it here at Southwest?

We call it, the **Southwest Pastoral Residency program**.

What is a residency program?

Like medical school residencies allow young doctors to hone their craft through the practice of medicine in the “real world,” the Southwest Pastoral Residency will give young pastors an opportunity to learn ministry while actually doing it.

Leaders from across the Valley (and the globe) will be invited to come work as a “resident” at Southwest where they will invest a defined season — usually two to three years — under the direction of church leadership and a world-class “resident faculty” to develop the requisite wisdom and pastoral skills that can only be gained through hands-on experience in the “trenches of ministry.” Along the way, residents will pursue a formal theological education and meet regularly with residency leadership to receive the personalized feedback and coaching needed to discern the kind of leader God has made them to be

THE SOUTHWEST RESIDENCY PROGRAM WILL:

- Recruit and train young, emerging leaders from the Coachella Valley and beyond
- Offset the educational expenses for emerging leaders so that their ministries will not be encumbered by debt
- Rally a world-class faculty of seasoned, veteran ministry leaders who will partner with Southwest leadership for training the residents
- Employ a Residency Director and Scholar-in-Residence to facilitate mentorship and integrate residents to life and ministry as a Southwest staffer and a ministry leader
- Unleash graduating residents to a lifetime of pastoral ministry

Building leaders for a lifetime of ministry

Now is the time to boldly follow God's call for our church and begin “building leaders for a lifetime of ministry.” We must learn to contend not only for the future success of Southwest Church but for the sake of God's Kingdom.

WHAT'S NEXT?

The Make Jesus Famous: the other 6 days (MJF) campaign kicks off NOW. After years of prayer and preparation, we believe God has called Southwest to act—to meet the needs of the community with Gospel-centered solutions. The MJF campaign is made up of three initiatives: Preschool, Counseling Center, and Pastoral Residency.

- To successfully implement all three initiatives, we need to raise **\$2 million**.
- The first goal of **\$600,000** is for the Preschool. This covers interior construction, the California code-mandated modifications, consulting, vital staffing, and our new playgrounds.
- The second goal is **\$290,000** for the Counseling Center. This covers interior renovation and construction of existing space to maximize privacy, California-mandated modifications, consulting, and key staffing.
- The third goal is **\$1,110,000** for the Pastoral Residency. This covers the launch of the residency with five leaders that Southwest will train over the next three years. It will also help cover educational expenses for the residents as well as cover the forming of a world-class faculty of seasoned, veteran ministry leaders who will partner with Southwest leadership for training within the residency. And it will cover employing a Residency Director and Scholar-in-Residence to facilitate mentorship and integrate residents to life and ministry.

The preschool is the first ministry we will launch upon reaching the goal of \$600,000. Following the preschool, we'll implement a much-needed counseling center and then launch our pastoral residency.
